


LOCAL HEALTH CLINICS

LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICTS



WHALE WATCHING


Victoria is known as one of the best places in the world to see whales in their natural habitat. Join a whale watching tour and spot orcas, humpback whales, and other marine wildlife.




JUAN DE FUCA PROVINCIAL PARK

A wilderness park that offers a range of outdoor activities, from hiking and mountain biking to kayaking and rock climbing.


WITTY'S LAGOON REGIONAL PARK
